District Attorney Nathan Hochman
County of Los Angeles

On Dec. 3, 2024, Nathan J. Hochman was sworn in as the 44th District Attorney of Los Angeles County, vowing to improve public safety by pursuing appropriate sentences for violent and serious offenders, while offering counseling and rehabilitation to those whose crimes were motivated by addiction or mental illness.

A lifelong Angeleno, DA Hochman served as Assistant U.S. Attorney General for the Tax Division of the Department of Justice in 2008. Prior to that, he was an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Central District of California from 1990 to 1997, serving in the Criminal Division. He also had an extensive career in the private sector, as a partner of several nationwide law firms and as a leading expert in tax law, criminal defense and environmental law. DA Hochman previously served as President of the Los Angeles City Ethics Commission. He graduated magna cum laude from Brown University and earned his law degree from Stanford Law School.

Steve Samuelian, CEO of California Consulting, Inc., has a distinguished career spanning more than 41 years in political and civic leadership. A Los Angeles native, he began his public service in 1982 and served as District Director for California's 19th Congressional District for eight years. In 2002, Steve was elected to the California State Assembly, representing the 29th Assembly District, where he served on the Assembly Appropriations Committee and as Vice-Chairman of the Assembly Elections and Redistricting Committee.

In 2004, Steve founded California Consulting, Inc., which has since become the largest grant-writing firm in the state. Cal. Consulting currently has contracts with more than 130 cities, school districts, counties, special districts, community colleges and others in several states.

Under his leadership, the firm has secured over \$1.5 billion in funding for its clients, including cities, school districts, and other public agencies, empowering communities to achieve their goals and thrive.

Throughout his career, Steve has been actively involved in various organizations, including serving as a board member of the Los Angeles County Business Federation (BizFed), where he received several awards. He has also been an ambassador for the USC Unruh Institute and co-chaired the Athenian Leadership Council at USC and has served on the Board of Directors of a County United Way, a Crimestoppers Board, and the Board of a Chamber of Commerce. Steve has been quoted in local, state, and national media on various public policy issues and has participated in numerous panels, workshops, and webinars on topics ranging from grant writing to economic development.

Supervisor Janice Hahn
Los Angeles County

Janice Hahn was elected to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors in 2016. She has dedicated her career to public service, following in the footsteps of her father Supervisor Kenny Hahn, who served for 40 years on the Board of Supervisors.

During her time on the Board, Supervisor Janice Hahn has worked tirelessly to invest in the communities she represents and fulfill LA County's mission of being a safety net for our most vulnerable residents, whether they are sick, incarcerated, living with mental illness, or living in poverty. Among the programs she created is LA Found, an innovative program that offers trackable bracelets to families with loved ones who are prone to wandering due to Alzheimer's, dementia, or autism. As one of the many Americans who has had a loved one who experienced a devastating stroke, she partnered with UCLA Health to bring the West Coast's first Mobile Stroke Unit to Los Angeles County.

In 2021, Supervisor Hahn began what she has described as the most meaningful endeavor in her career: leading the successful effort to return the property known as Bruce's Beach to the living descendants of Willa and Charles Bruce nearly a century after it was taken illegally from the couple because they were African American. By returning this property in 2022, Los Angeles County became the first government body in the nation to return land stolen from a Black family during the Jim Crow era.

Hahn previously served on the Los Angeles City Charter Reform Commission, the Los Angeles City Council, and in the US House of Representatives.

City Attorney Mike Webb
City of Redondo Beach

Mike Webb has been the City Attorney for the City of Redondo Beach for nearly 20 years, currently serving in his fifth term. Prior to his election as City Attorney, he accumulated 17 years of experience as City Prosecutor, Deputy City Prosecutor, and Deputy District Attorney. In addition, Webb is in his fifth term as President of the Los Angeles County Prosecutors Association.

In his positions as City Attorney and City Prosecutor, Webb has demonstrated a strong commitment to supporting the Redondo Beach Police Department's Community-Based Policing Philosophy. He served as a legal advisor for "Operation Bull Market," which received the League of California Cities' Helen Putnam Award as the top public safety program in California. Additionally, he coordinated and implemented a comprehensive gang abatement strategy that included a nationally recognized and highly successful civil gang injunction program.

After the tragic events of 9-11, Webb was extensively involved in developing a regional model for Homeland Security. He served as a member of the California Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Terrorism Training Advisory Committee, which identified and developed numerous terrorism related training courses for California Law Enforcement. Webb has lectured on the topic of Homeland Security from a local perspective to Police Chiefs and Sheriffs throughout California.

Recently, Webb developed Redondo's Enhanced Response to Homelessness program, which includes the first outdoor Homeless Court in Los Angeles County. This initiative has resulted in a more than 60% reduction in the number of unhoused individuals in Redondo Beach. In 2022, the program was also honored with the League of California Cities Helen Putnam Award.

Webb has taught Constitutional Law for the University of Southern California Gould School of Law. He received his BA in Political Science and Economics from the University of California, Santa Barbara and his JD from the University of California College of the Law, San Francisco.

Ronson Chu joined the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) as the senior project manager for Homelessness and Senior Services in 2021. In this role he had developed and operated a variety of homeless programs for his 16 cities and unincorporated areas. Programs administered through the SBCCOG include, Time Limited Subsidies, Housing Location Services, Case Management, Interim Beds, and Client Aid for Security Deposits, Application Fees, Reunification Costs, and more.

Prior to his work with the SBCCOG, Ronson worked for the Los Angeles Homeless Service Authority (LAHSA) where he managed the organization's internal budgets and worked with various federal, local and philanthropic funding partners.

Ronson was born in Taiwan, moved to Texas, and grew up in the Bay Area and Silicon Valley. Before working in homelessness, Ronson had a career in corporate finance and operations for brands including United Online, Macy's/Bloomingdales Logistics, and Screen Engine/ASI, a leading entertainment market research firm. He took Screen Engine/ASI from a start-up to a profitable private equity firm in under five years.

North Redondo Beach is where Ronson, his wife and two young kids call home. In his spare time, he runs a local adult pick-up basketball league.

Chief Manny Cid was appointed as Glendale's 20th Police Chief on January 16th, 2023. As Glendale's Police Chief and a law enforcement leader, Chief Cid brings a collaborative leadership style to leading an organization, a proactive approach to community-centric policing, an unwavering commitment to professionalism, and a focus on fostering and preserving partnerships.

Prior to joining the Glendale Police Department, Chief Cid served the Culver City community for nearly 20 years as a member of their police department, including as their Chief of Police from 2020-2022. Throughout his two-decade law enforcement career, Manny has had the opportunity to serve in a vast array of assignments and leadership roles. Manny's law enforcement career includes extensive experience in the areas of field operations, investigations, administration and professional standards, as well as emergency management. Manny has also had the opportunity to work on multiple local, state, and federal taskforces, impacting public safety on a regional level. Chief Cid holds law enforcement executive leadership positions at the local, county, and state levels, including currently serving as the President of the LA County Police Chief's Association, as well as Chair of the Executive Board for the LA IMPACT Taskforce. In addition, Chief Cid also currently serves on the Community Board for the Glendale Memorial Hospital.

Manny possesses his Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from Whittier College, as well as his Master's degree in Public Administration and Organizational Leadership from National University. In addition to his formal education, Manny is a graduate of the Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute, the West Point Leadership Program, California's POST Executive Development Course, and the FBI's National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. During his career, Manny has been the recipient of several law enforcement awards and honors, including the Sustained Superiority Award, the Distinguished Service Medal, and the Career Achievement Award. In 2024, the Glendale Latino Association honored Chief Cid with their "Man of the Year" award.

Chief Cid is a first-generation Cuban-American, who has spent most his life living and working in the greater Los Angeles area. Manny is an avid sports fan, and in his free time enjoys spending time with his family, staying active, and traveling.

Mark E. Henderson, Ed. D was first elected by the citizens of Gardena in March 2015 to serve as a member of the City Council. He was elected a second term in March 2020 and most recently to his third term. Prior to his election as a Councilmember, he served the City of Gardena as an appointed member of the Planning and Environmental Quality Commission, from 2010 to 2013. As the past chairman (during 2012), he worked to be an effective leader of the Planning Commission and proactively collaborated with community members, city council and city staff, exhibiting valuable insight into understanding the needs of the residents and businesses of the entire community. Before that appointment, he served as a Member-at-Large for the City of Gardena Rent Mediation Board. In that role he worked tirelessly to ensure that landlord and tenant discussions were civil, ended with both parties satisfied, and that the most appropriate measures were executed. He later became a community leader within the Gardena Environmental Justice Committee.

Henderson was born in Harbor City, CA, and was raised in Los Angeles County. After completing his military service in the U.S. Navy, he obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in Telecommunications Management from DeVry University, a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Redlands, and a Doctorate in Organizational Leadership from the University of La Verne. He is currently an administrator at the Los Angeles Community College District since 2002. In 2014, the Center for Digital Education recognized him as a Top 30 Technologist, Transformer, and Trailblazer.

As part of his role with Flock Safety, he is actively engaged in organizations such as the National League of Cities, the US Conference of Mayors, and Cal Cities and has represented Flock at over 300 Council meetings. He has a background in Local Government and Tech, having held roles at Waze Carpool, Downtown Santa Monica, San Diego MTS, and Miami before his transition to Flock as an early employee.



Lt. John Lee

City of Alhambra

Lt. John Lee has served with the Alhambra Police Department for the past 18 years, overseeing key areas such as the UAS/DFR program, Dispatch, Backgrounds & Recruitment, and various other collateral duties.

In 2019, Lt. Lee played a pivotal role in establishing Alhambra PD's Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) program, which started with just one pilot and has since expanded to a team of 15 pilots. Building on that foundation, in 2023, Lt. Lee led the department's efforts in researching and testing Drone as First Responder programs, ultimately selecting Aerodome/Flock as the preferred platform.

Since launching DFR operations in June 2024, Alhambra PD has conducted 884 missions, proving the program to be a critical resource for enhancing response times, situational awareness, and officer safety. Through Lt. Lee's leadership, the department continues to innovate, leveraging technology to improve public safety and better serve the community.

John Lee was first elected to the Los Angeles City Council during a special election in August 2019, and re-elected to his first full term in March 2020. As a CD12 resident of over 40 years, John found his passion for public service at an early age when he first began volunteering for local nonprofits while in middle school. A lifelong public servant, John has been serving this community his entire adult life. 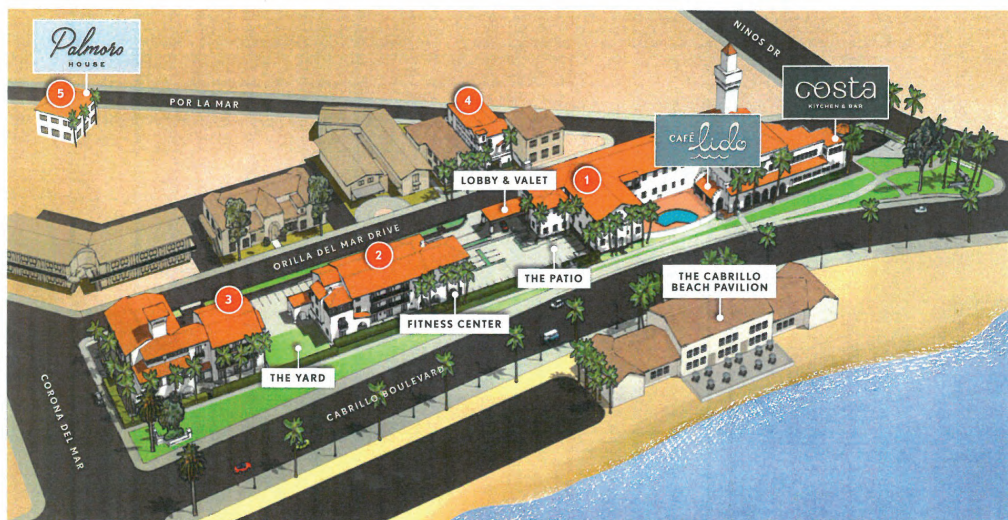
